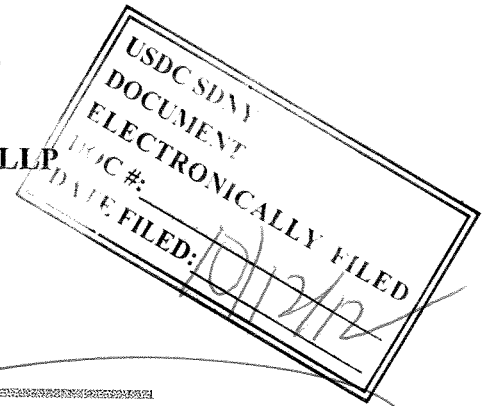



Dear Judge Briccetti:

Three days after I originally submitted my motion documents in the above-referenced matter, a "Note to Attorney to Re-File Document – Deficient Docket Entry Error" was entered into ECF. I noticed this on October 9, 2012. The reason for this error was due to my attempt to include my filed documents (Notice to Pro Se Litigant, Attorney Declaration, Memorandum of Law, Copies of Unpublished or Exclusively Reported Cases Cited In Said Memorandum and Affidavit of Service) in one document. After consulting with the very helpful Ms. Hilbert, I re-filed all of the documents. The pro se plaintiff, Mr. Teitelbaum, was originally served via certified mail on September 21, 2012, since he is not registered on ECF.
