In reference to the Defendants Kiryas Joel EMS and Rubenstein, there seems to be a discrepancy between the Hon. Court's order of Feb 11th and that of Feb 22nd, regarding which claims Plaintiff was granted leave to amend.


In the Court's order of Feb 11th, the Court dismissed the 1983 and 1985 claims without prejudice, while granting leave to amend only the 1985 against above Defendants, leaving Plaintiff to wonder if the court intended to allow Plaintiff to re-file the 1983 claims in a new action only, but not allowing to amend those claims in the pending action.

Whereas, in its Feb 22nd order, the Hon. Court granted leave to amend both 1983 as well as 1985 claims against Defendants Katz and Tennenbaum, in doing so, the Court drew a parallel between both groups of Defendants, stating that it similarly grants Plaintiff leave to amend against Katz and Tennenbaum as it did in it's Feb 11th order against KJ EMS and Rubenstein, leaving Plaintiff to wonder again what claims the Court intended to allow amending against KJ EMS and Rubenstein.

Wherefore, Plaintiff respectfully requests 1) clarification from the Hon. Court, which claims Plaintiff can amend against Defendants Kiryas Joel EMS and Rubenstein; 2) Plaintiff kindly requests that the two weeks extra time to perfect the Motion to Reconsider to start from when the Court issues a clarification as to the above, allowing Plaintiff enough time to consider the arguments for the Motion.
